Tom is a writer, director, and performer who has been making adventurous work for, by and with young people for 15 years. He founded KIT in 2015 wth a mission to use immersive theatre to improve children's educational engagment and achievement and unlock their creative talent.

Tom has created and delivered immersive adventures to more than 15,000 Young People and 150 schools; partnering with Unicorn Theatre, Birmingham REP, Great Ormond Street Hospital and the Natural History Museum along the way.

Tom co-created and starred in BAC's Offie-Nominated The Good Neighbour in 2013/14 and was a game designer on the BAFTA-winning educational video game Nightmare High.

Sessions will explore accessible ways teachers can use immersive theatre & game techniques to expand their practice and drive pupil engagement.





James McDermott graduated from UEA with an MA (Distinction) in Scriptwriting.

James's plays published by Samuel French include Rubber Ring (Pleasance Islington/UK Tour) and Time & Tide (Park Theatre/UK Tour).
